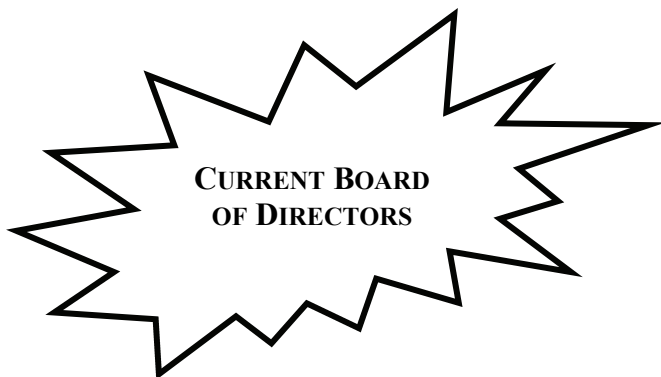


Board of Directors Election April 2011

The 2011 elections for the Board of Directors will be held in mid April. There will be (3) three seats available including the Treasurer position, which is currently vacant. If you are interested in running for a position on the Board, you must submit your resume to the general manager manager@icr.hrcoxmail.com no later than Tuesday, February 15, 2011, by 5:00 PM. Your resume must be written with 150 words or less. If there are more than 150 words, your resume will not be accepted until it is corrected. In addition, resumes will be printed as is so please, proof read and edit carefully. All resumes along with a picture of the candidates will be published on the website and posted in the store.

Ballots for the 2011 Elections will be mailed in March. Each member will be mailed (1) one ballot per membership owned and has the right to vote for (3) three candidates per membership owned. Example: If you have (2) two memberships you will vote for (3) three candidates on the first membership ballot and (3) three candidates on the second membership ballot. You may choose to vote for less than the number of candidates. If you do not receive the correct number of ballots please, notify the office, immediately. The Accounting Firm of Wilfore and Associates will oversee the entire voting process. This includes receiving the ballots directly and giving the final tally to the Board of Directors at the Annual Meeting in April. You can also hand deliver your ballot(s) to the representative prior to the meeting being called to order. The (3) three candidates with the highest number of votes will be announced at the meeting.

Welcome to Indian Cove Resort. Whether you are one of the many new members at ICR, a returning member or a guest, we want everyone to have a great time while in the park. To ensure that ICR is safe and fun for everyone and to create a family oriented environment, it is important for all of us to know and understand the rules and regulations. Please ask the reservation staff for a new member's packet that contains a copy of The Declaration, the Bylaws and the Standing Rules and Regulations.

PAYMENTS UPON CHECK IN

All Members and guests are expected to pay all charges upon **Check In**. This includes membership dues (past & present), tows (in & out), wood, merchandise and usages fees. The staff will need to collect outstanding balances and all charges before you set up on site. If you check out early we will refund the unused days.

All Members and guests **MUST Check In** at the office prior to putting your camper on site. The period between **Check Out** (10:00 AM) and **Check In** (2:00 PM) allows the staff to service each site regularly. If the site is available and ready, we are happy for you to **Check In** early without penalty.

GOLF CARTS

When we open in March, all golf carts must be inspected before they are allowed to be driven in the park. All carts must have working front and rear lights, reflector tape along the side and your membership number(s) displayed. Both the Office and Patrol staff will be able to handle the inspection. A "2011 Inspection" sticker will be placed on the windshield. You must present **proof of insurance** at the time of inspection. Also, anyone driving a golf cart must possess a valid driver's license or be 18 years old.

SPEED LIMIT

The speed limit in the park is 5 mph. Speeding has become the number one complaint of most members and has become a serious problem for the staff. Please remember that there are many pedestrians in the park including children. If you have your foot on the gas... you are going too fast! Please inform your guests of our rules and regulations. The speed limit is for all vehicles including golf carts.

ON SITE STORAGE

Cars, trucks, motorcycles etc. are not allowed to park in onsite storage, located on Blue Heron. This area is designated for trailers (empty or not) only! It is also a storage space for those members who do not have a storage space in boat storage. If you have a rented space for your golf cart trailer, boat or utility trailer, please park your items on your space so we can accommodate everyone. Once you have parked your trailer, you must go to the office and let them know what space number you are in. Your membership number must be on your trailer along with a tag showing your site number, date in and date out.

The area adjacent to the store parking lot is roped off for those members who are boating for the day. You can park with your trailer hitched to your vehicle.

MEMBERSHIP NUMBERS

All trailers, golf carts, utility trailers etc. must have your membership numbers on it for identification. We need to know who to contact in case of an emergency. Please help us to protect you and your belongings.

DOGS

All dogs (big or small) must be secure at all times. This means on a leash with a human holding the other end, tied up on your site, in your camper or in a pen. All dog "poop" must be picked up "immediately" and not saved for when you are checking out. If you have a pen, you must put down lime before checking out. There is a \$50 fine for any dog not on a leash and a \$25 fine if "poop" is not picked up at the time it is dropped. If you check out and the next person finds one or more piles, there is a \$50 clean up fee that will be added to your account.
